An Act to Hire Medication Control Staff for the Counseling Center

- Whereas, the Tennessee Technological University Counseling Center provides essential services for the Tennessee Tech student body, and
- **Whereas,** the Center currently does not have a psychiatrist or psychiatric nurse practitioner to handle psychiatric medication, **and**
- Whereas, the number of students seen by the Counseling Center per academic year increased 182% between 2007/2008 and 2019/2020, and
- Whereas, many students rely on prescription psychiatric medication in addition to counseling, and
- Whereas, every public 4-year university in Tennessee provides medication management services except for Tennessee Tech, and
- Whereas, students coming from other areas of the state are forced to either find an off-campus provider or travel home purely for refills, and
- Whereas, as of 2018, Tennessee had a higher overall rate of suicide than the US average, and
- **Whereas,** as of 2018, Putnam County faced a higher overall rate than the Tennessee state average, **and**
- Whereas, due to the limited local resources, students often have difficulty finding psychiatric medication control in the area and risk going without, and
- Whereas, providing psychiatric medication control for students is essential in ensuring they do not go without psychiatric medication.

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION OF TENNESSEE TECHNOLOGICAL UNIVERSITY THAT

- Section 1: This bill shall be known as "An Act to Hire Medication Control Staff for the Counseling Center."
- Section 2: The University budget will extend to find, at the minimum, a part-time psychiatric nurse practitioner to handle prescription psychiatric medications for Tennessee Tech students.

Section 3: Students who have chronic, long-term, or specialized needs that the Counseling Center does not have the capacity to accommodate will continue to be given referrals to off-campus providers.

Section 4: The Counseling Center will continue to offer their normal services that include a solution-focused, brief-treatment session model, psychoeducation groups, and outreach programs and workshops.

Section 5: This act shall take effect immediately upon passing, the welfare of students depending on it.
