An Act to Hire Additional Staff for the Counseling Center

- Whereas, the Tennessee Technological University Counseling Center provides essential services for the Tennessee Tech student body, and
- Whereas, the number of students seen by the Counseling Center per academic year increased 182% between 2007/08 and 2019/2020, and
- Whereas, the number of counseling sessions increased 150% between the same years, and
- Whereas, the Counseling Center, despite the growth, has continually been understaffed given the amount of students since 2005, and
- Whereas, students are now limited to 12 counseling sessions per academic year, and
- Whereas, the counselor-to-student ratio is currently 1:2035, but to meet the International Accreditation of Counseling Services' standards, a minimum of two counselors is required, and
- Whereas, the Counseling Center has had to limit programs due to an inadequate number of staff, and
- Whereas, resources in the Upper Cumberland are limited, so finding off-campus counseling can be a long process, and
- Whereas, as of 2018, Tennessee had a higher overall rate of suicide than the US average, and
- **Whereas,** as of 2018, Putnam County faced a higher overall rate than the Tennessee state average, **and**
- Whereas, due to the limited local resources, students often have difficulty finding consistent counseling in the area, and
- Whereas, students' wellness is essential in ensuring a fulfilling academic life.

NOW THEREFORE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION OF TENNESSEE TECHNOLOGICAL UNIVERSITY THAT

- Section 1: This bill shall be known as "An Act to Hire Additional Staff for the Counseling Center."
- **Section 2:** University funds shall be allotted to hiring an additional counselor.

Section 3: In the future, the staff levels for the Counseling Center will be kept to meet the International Accreditation of Counseling Services' student-to-counselor standards.

Section 4: Students who have chronic, long-term, or specialized needs will continue to be given referrals to off-campus providers.

Section 5: This Bill shall take effect immediately upon passage by the Student Government Association, the welfare of the students requiring it.
