SGA Bill S24-SB-001 An Act to Add More Accessible Service Animal Water Fountains on The Tennessee Tech Campus

- Whereas, students, especially those with service animals, may bring their water bowls to campus to keep their animals hydrated, and,
- Whereas, the only current water fountain with this accommodation is at Walton Park. If students were to forget a bowl, they would have to walk a long distance to the outskirts of campus, and,
- Whereas, having two or more in the center of campus would give students with service animals more local locations on campus, and,
- Whereas, tech's future Pedestrian Mall is under construction, water fountains that accommodate students' service animals should be included, as well as in other heavy foot traffic areas around campus,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION OF TENNESSEE TECHNOLOGICAL UNIVERSITY THAT

- Section 1: This Bill shall be known as the "Accessible Water Fountain Act of 2024".
- Section 2: The proper facilities should add service animal-accommodated water fountains to locations at Pedestrian Mall and other central locations on campus. These locations include the Volpe Library, the Marc L. Burnett Student Recreation Center, and across from Crawford Hall on the Quad.
- Section 3: These water fountains should be located out of the sun to avoid extremely high-water temperatures.
- Section 4: This Bill shall take effect immediately following passage by the Student Government Association, the welfare of the students requiring it.
